A Message from the Principal

Hello everyone,

This newsletter, and my report in particular, contains quite a bit of information regarding Compass and the services we will be using it for. I have endeavoured to make sure the instructions are as simple as possible but would love to hear feedback if you are finding anything particularly difficult or confusing.

Bushfire Preparedness: As MMPS is a Category 1 Bushfire At Risk School (BARR-1), we have very detailed and considered bushfire preparedness plans. One of these plans includes relocating to Romsey PS on days of forecast Extreme weather. I receive these forecasts directly from the Department of Education's Emergency Management department and these can sometimes vary from what is publicly published. If a day is forecast to be Extreme you will receive an emergency text message from Compass and you will need to reply to the school mobile with whether or not your child will be attending school and relocating OR if you will be keeping your child home to enact your own bushfire safety plans. I am very aware of the nature of bushfire risk in Mount Macedon and fully support your decision to enact your own fire plans. We sent a test text message out last week and are still waiting on a few families to respond, if you could please make sure each person in your household that received a message could reply as soon as possible.

Meet The Teacher: We opened up the booking process for our Meet The Teacher interviews yesterday through Compass. You can access the booking form by clicking through to the 'Conferences' section of Compass. There are links on the 'Dashboard' if you're using a desktop browser or you can click on the 'more' tab at the bottom of your screen if using a mobile device. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this process, or any feedback in general, please do not hesitate to contact the school. As we move through our transition to using Compass, I'm sure there will be some things we can improve moving forward so please provide us with feedback when necessary.

<u>Lunch Orders:</u> Lunch orders are now available to order through Compass. We offer lunch orders on Mondays and Fridays this year. On Mondays you can order sushi and on Fridays we offer a lunch menu from the Trading Post. Orders are made through the 'Canteen' menu on Compass. On a desktop browser click on the 'Community' tab at the top of your screen (a little icon of two people) and then select 'Canteen' and follow the prompts. On a mobile device select the 'More' tab at the bottom of your screen, then select 'Canteen' and follow the prompts.

<u>School Photos:</u> School photos will be held on the 31st of March and your photo packs can now be ordered through Compass. You should have a notification when you sign in that will give you instructions on how to do this. We will not be sending home paper order forms this year.

<u>Welcome BBQ:</u> Our annual Welcome BBQ is this coming Friday from 5:30pm here at school. This is a great opportunity for new families to meet and greet and get to know others. To help our children navigate this pivotal time, we're thrilled to introduce Branch Out—a dynamic, evidence-based program designed to support our primary school students in achieving optimal mental health and well-being now and into the future!

What is in store?

Through the innovative use of live theatre in collaboration with *Brainstorm Productions*, students will be presented with a wellbeing and resilience program called 'Being Brave'. This program equips our young learners with the tools to recognise and regulate their emotions as well as support others with taught positive coping strategies!

Offered by mental health clinicians from *Tuning in to Kids*, caregivers and teachers are also offered emotional coaching to help respond to their children's emotions and help foster their ability to regulate emotions themselves.

Branch Out takes a proactive and preventative approach to mental health, aiming to address challenges before they arise—setting our children up for success as they move into high school and beyond.




